
**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF DEER PARK, WASHINGTON
ADOPTING A CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY APPLICABLE TO
CITY ELECTED AND APPOINTED OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES,
CONSULTANTS, AND AGENTS.**

WHEREAS, the City has been advised by Spokane County that as a 2012 Community Development Block Grant (“CDBG”) Subrecipient, one requirement is to maintain a Conflict of Interest Policy; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined passage of this Resolution is in the best interest of the citizens of the City; **NOW, THEREFORE**,

**THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DEER PARK, WASHINGTON
HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. This Conflict of Interest Policy is hereby adopted and shall apply to all elected and appointed officers, employees, consultants, and agents of the City of Deer Park who exercise any function or responsibility with respect to the award or administration of contracts, or are in a position to participate in the decision-making process to gain inside information with regard to the award or administration of contracts for the procurement of goods or services (hereinafter collectively referred to as “City Officials”). City Officials shall be prohibited from obtaining any personal or financial interest or benefit from any such activity or having any interest in any such contract, subcontract, or agreement or the process which results in a contract, subcontract, or agreement with: (a) themselves, (b) immediate family members, or (c) individuals or businesses with which they have economic relationships (other than what any



non-City official may have as a typical retail customer) during their tenure as a City Official and for a period of one (1) year thereafter. For purposes of this Resolution the phrase “contracts for the procurement of any goods or services” shall include all City public works contracts and other City purchases.

Section 2. In addition to the Conflict of Interest Policy set forth in Section 1 of this Resolution, the City and all City Officials shall comply with all provisions of any state or federal laws, rules and regulations that apply to the award or administration of contracts for the procurement of any goods or services.

Section 3. The exceptions identified in RCW 42.23.030 and any “remote interests” as defined in RCW 42.23.040 shall be authorized exceptions to the provisions of Sections 1 and 2 of this Resolution.

Section 4. All references in this Resolution to state and federal laws, rules and regulations shall be as the same exist now or may hereafter be amended.


Section 5. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon passage by the City Council.
